York Historical Architectural Review Board

Meeting Minutes

5:30 PM Wednesday, January 2, 2013

DRAFT

A meeting of the York Historical Architectural Review Board was held on Wednesday, January 2nd, 2013 at 5:30 PM at 25 North Duke Street, York, PA.

Members in attendance included John Fox, Chair; Dennis Kunkle, Vice Chair; Teresa Johnescu; Dave Redshaw; Craig Zumbrun; Mark Shermeyer; Robyn Pottorff; and HARB Consultant Alycia Reiten.

Absent: Matt Argabright; Justine Landis

On a motion by Dave Redshaw, second by Mark Shermeyer, the board voted 6-0 to *Approve* the minutes of the December 5th, 2012 HARB meeting.

The following case is forwarded to York City Council with the recommended actions (note cases out of order from agenda, waiting for one additional presenter for 731 South George Street):

1. 228 West Market Street – A request by Richard Gribble for a Certificate of Appropriateness to install a side yard fence similar to the existing with additional visibility panels.

Points of Discussion:

- The application was presented by Frank Dittenhafer. He described the whole project including the demolition and rear wall improvements as previously approved by HARB.
- He described the need to install fencing to secure the property. The location is proposed along the former block building line. 85' long, 1x cedar with saw tooth design to match the existing fence on the other side of the property. The length of the line of fencing is a concern so they propose some visibility panels for transparency.
- The panels are a simple perforated metal (sample shown). Propose to paint a dark green.
- Dave Redshaw suggested the panels should remain the natural galvanized metal color which would match the existing weathered wood fencing. The applicant agreed.

On a motion by Craig Zumbrun, second by Robyn Pottorff, the board voted 6-0 to *Approve* the application as discussed.

2. 731 South George Street – A request by Mike Johnson for a Certificate of Appropriateness to replace the entire deteriorated slate roof with a new alternate material as well as brick cleaning, repointing and repainting as needed.

Points of Discussion

- The application was presented by Mike Johnson and Gary Geiselman. Gary Geiselman explained that the project is not going as expected. The roof is in much worse condition than they believed when they presented last month therefore request a modification to the roofing.
- He explained that the slate is no good; the nails are failing, rusted right through causing the slate to crumble and fall off. The valleys and decking are all bad. The entire roof including the tower needs to be completely redone. The cost for new slate as originally proposed was more expensive than the house will sell for after stabilization.
- The applicant showed a variety of alternate materials for the roofing replacement. The discussion revolved mostly around the use of Timberline in a grey color. This alternate material is found throughout York and other historic communities were mentioned as well where Timberline has been an acceptable alternative.
- Teresa Johnescu asked if the red strip decoration on the roof could be replicated. The applicant said they will see what they can do. A sample photo of a property in Cape May using Timberline shingles is shown with an integrated band of color.
- The applicant also provided information related to the exterior brick. The building was not originally painted. The paint is in bad shape and should come off so they propose to do a mild cleaning of the entire building. They will meet the standards for a low pressure, non-abrasive cleaner.

On a motion by John Fox, second by Mark Shermeyer the board voted 6-0 to *Approve* the application with the following stipulations:

- Retain the existing weather vane
 - Low pressure power cleaning to remove the paint from the brick, subject to staff review;
 - Repair and repoint as needed to match as closely as possible in color, texture, hardness and tooling and seal with a clear matte sealant.
3. 267-269 East Market Street – A request by Dan Heit for a Certificate of Appropriateness to remove deteriorated asphalt shingle roofing from the front roof and slate from the rear and install new asphalt shingles throughout.

Points of Discussion:

- The application was presented by Devon Myers on behalf of Dan Heit for the Justice Youth program. She explained that the building roof is in disrepair. Photos show slipping 3-tab shingles along the front and sides of the building. The tower is slate and will not be modified. The rear is also slate but is in need of replacement and not very visible. She asks to have shingles put on everything but the tower.
- The board discussed different alternate materials for replacement. The replacement of the 3-tab shingles in kind is appropriate but not acceptable for the slate at the rear. The rear of the building has limited visibility.
- Mark Shermeyer explains that replacement using alternate materials has been considered acceptable in the past.
- The board discussed replacement of the roof with all Timberline for consistency. The applicant asked if 3-tab could be put back for the 3-tab and Timberline for the slate. The board explained the consistency of appearance and the preference for the Timberline shingles for the entire roof as being an appropriate modern replacement material.

On a motion by Dave Redshaw, second by Mark Shermeyer, the board voted 6-0 to *Approve* replacement of the roofing on all roofs with Timberline shingles including the rear, but not the tower, in slate grey color.

V Other Business

1. Election of officers for 2013

On a motion by Dave Redshaw, second by Robyn Potorff, the board voted 6-0 to *Accept* the officers remain John Fox as Chair and Dennis Kunkle as Vice Chair.

2. A discussion related to the proposed HARB Ordinance draft was continued to the next meeting.

Being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 6:50pm.





WHEREAS, on November 14, 2012, the City of York Fire Civil Service Board certified an eligibility list of thirteen(13) individuals that are eligible for consideration to be appointed as Probationary Firefighters; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Civil Service Board has certified the top three names on the eligibility list; and

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the Department of Fire/Rescue Services; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Fire/Rescue Services would like the ability to use the eligibility list to make a conditional offer of employment for the position of Probationary Firefighter to Johnathan Brown subject to Mr. Brown's ability to meet several conditions set forth below; and

WHEREAS, the following conditions must be met prior to an appointment to the position of Probationary Firefighter, to-wit:

1. The applicant must successfully pass a psychological examination as required by the City of York Fire Civil Service Board.
2. The applicant must successfully pass a medical examination as required by the City of York Fire Civil Service Board.
3. The applicant must successfully pass a background investigation as required by the City of York Fire Civil Service Board; and

WHEREAS, if Johnathan Brown does not meet the above conditions, a conditional offer of employment would be offered to the next suitable individual in compliance with the Fire Civil Service provisions subject to the same conditions for hiring as set forth above, and if no candidate is ultimately deemed qualified, the Department of Fire/Rescue Services will request a new list of eligible individuals from the City of York Fire Civil Service Board.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of York, Pennsylvania, that Council hereby approves and accepts the City of York Fire Civil Service Board's eligibility list, certifying that the top three candidates on the list of thirteen (13) individuals are eligible for consideration for appointment to the position of Probationary Firefighter after meeting the aforementioned conditions contained in this Resolution, and approves the appointment of one Probationary Firefighter effective February 18, 2013, subject to the conditions set forth above.
