



Meeting Minutes

A meeting of the York Historical Architectural Review Board was held on Wednesday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013 at 5:30 PM at 101 South George Street, York, PA.

Members in attendance included John Fox, Chair; Dennis Kunkle, Vice Chair; Teresa Johnescu; Mark Shermeyer; Justine Landis; Genevieve Ray. Dave Redshaw and Robyn Pottorff arrived late.

Absent: Matt Argabright, Craig Zumbrun

On a motion by Mark Shermeyer, second by Justine Landis, the board voted 5-0 to *Approve* the minutes of the April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2013 HARB meeting.

The order of cases was changed to allow for longer time discussion for the Habitat application. The following cases are forwarded to York City Council with the recommended actions:

1. 332 East Locust Street – A request by Rich Neher for a Certificate of Appropriateness to replace existing rear 1/1 wood windows with Simonton #6500 replacement 1/1 vinyl windows.

Points of Discussion:

- Donald Seidel presented the case with owner Judy Fry.
- John Fox asked about the lower windows. The owner responded that they are wood with metal casing and are the same as the second story but the second story windows are more worn.
- Mark Shermeyer asked if the frames would be left and restored. The contractor said they intend to wrap the frames. Mark Shermeyer said he is concerned about the details. Donald Seidel said that they chose a color other than white to reduce the “vinyl” appearance.
- The owner explained that the replacement is for the two windows on the third floor only.

On a motion by Genevieve Ray, second by Justine Landis, the board voted 5-0 to *Approve* the proposed application as presented. Dave Redshaw recused himself from the vote because he missed the discussion.

- Dave Redshaw asked about the time and care to dry the treated lumber and the applicant replied that it is built into the project plan to allow for.
- Steve Munchel explained that he is trying to replicate the historic appearance. Full fiberglass is preferred because they can be ordered to fit.
- John Fox said the sash width should be the same as the original. Vinyl and fiberglass are often narrow.
- Dave Redshaw asked how well the window they placed on the home blended. Steve Munchel replied that the neighboring homes have storms that make it hard to assess.
- John Fox mentioned Anderson and Pella options that are available in clad that have ¼” increments to order in and are often used in restoration work.
- Discussion continued about trim, cladding, neighboring similarities, finishes and treatments.
- Dave Redshaw asked about the finish for the gable. Steve Munchel replied that plywood will be replaced with cement board.
- The light on the front of the house is proposed to match lights that are on neighbors.
- The heavy stone steps will be reset with a black metal railing that will match the neighbors.
- Propose to remove the plywood and match the treatment of the h-3.
- Downspouts proposed to be same configuration but larger.

On a motion by Dennis Kunkle, second by Dave Redshaw, the board voted 6-0 to *Approve* the application as presented with the stipulation that the doors all be four panel, the bay sheeting remain, and that the lighting fixture be as pictured in D-1 submission for the front of the building.

The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation

The Standards (Department of Interior regulations, 36 CFR Part 67) pertain to historic buildings of all materials, construction types, sizes and occupancy and encompass the exterior and the interior, related landscape features and the building's site and environment as well as attached, adjacent or related new construction. HARB applies these Standards to specific rehabilitation projects in a reasonable manner, taking into consideration economic and technical feasibility.

1. A property will be used as it was historically or be given a new use that requires minimal change to its distinctive materials, features, spaces, and spatial relationships.
2. The historic character of a property will be retained and preserved. The removal of distinctive materials or alteration of features, spaces, and spatial relationships that characterize a property will be avoided.
3. Each property will be recognized as a physical record of its time, place, and use. Changes that create a false sense of historical development, such as adding conjectural features or elements from other historic properties, will not be undertaken.
4. Changes to a property that have acquired historic significance in their own right will be retained and preserved.
5. Distinctive materials, features, finishes, and construction techniques or examples of craftsmanship that characterize a property will be preserved.
6. Deteriorated historic features will be repaired rather than replaced. Where the severity of deterioration requires replacement of a distinctive feature, the new feature will match the old in design, color, texture, and, where possible, materials. Replacement of missing features will be substantiated by documentary and physical evidence.
7. Chemical or physical treatments, if appropriate, will be undertaken using the gentlest means possible. Treatments that cause damage to historic materials will not be used.
8. Archaeological resources will be protected and preserved in place. If such resources must be disturbed, mitigation measures will be undertaken.
9. New additions, exterior alterations, or related new construction will not destroy historic materials, features, and spatial relationships that characterize the property. The new work shall be differentiated from the old and will be compatible with the historic materials, features, size, scale and proportion, and massing to protect the integrity of the property and its environment.
10. New additions and adjacent or related new construction will be undertaken in such a manner that, if removed in the future, the essential form and integrity of the historic property and its environment would be unimpaired.




