- II. Committee Issues for the April 4 & 18, 2017 legislative Agenda as follows:

## PUBLIC WORKS (View Issues Chart)

## 1. Resolution authorizing a contract with York Materials Group (for asphalt mixes).

Director Gross said this is a routine contract entered into for the purpose of purchasing asphalt materials. He stated that York Material Group is only company in York County that provides this material and fortunately there has been a slight reduction in costs from last year.

**DECISION:** A motion was made by Nelson, seconded by Ritter-Dickson, to place this item on the **4/4/17** legislative agenda. The motion passed by the following vote: Yeas – Ritter-Dickson, Helfrich, Nelson – 3; Nays – 0.

FIRE (View Issues Chart)

## 1. Bill amending the 2017 Budget (to transfer 2016 AFG grant award funds)

Fire Chief Michaels explained that this bill is to amend the 2017 York City Budget for the Department of Fire/Rescue to reflect the rollover of the AFG-Training Grant for funds not expended in the 2016 budget year, in the amount of \$48,328.95.

# 2. Bill amending the 2017 Budget (for a State Fire Commission grant award)

Chief Michaels stated that this bill is to amend the York City Budget for the year 2017 by appropriating revenue and expenditures for the Department of Fire/Rescue in the amount of \$14,900.00 for a State Fire Commission Grant awarded to allow purchase of PPV fans, bail-out kits, hose and appliances for department personnel.

### 3. Bill amending the 2017 Budget (for an FM Global grant award).

Chief Michaels stated that this bill is to amend the York City Budget for the year 2017 by appropriating revenue and expenditures for the Department of Fire/Rescue in the amount of \$1,623.00 for an FM Global Grant award received to allow purchase of fire safety training videos.

**DECISION:** A motion was made by Nelson, seconded by Ritter-Dickson, to place this item on the **4/4/17** legislative agenda. The motion passed by the following vote: Yeas – Ritter-Dickson, Walker, Nelson – 3; Nays – 0.

## POLICE/BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (HR) (View Issues Chart)

#### 1. Resolution authorizing conditional offers of employment as probationary police officers.

Councilwoman Walker explained that these positions are being filled because of vacancies created through attrition.

**DECISION:** A motion was made by Nelson, seconded by Ritter-Dickson, to place this item on the **4/4/17** legislative agenda. The motion passed by the following vote: Yeas – Ritter-Dickson, Walker, Nelson – 3; Nays – 0.

#### 1. Bill authorizing the inclusion of 2016 ordinances into the Codified Ordinance book.
