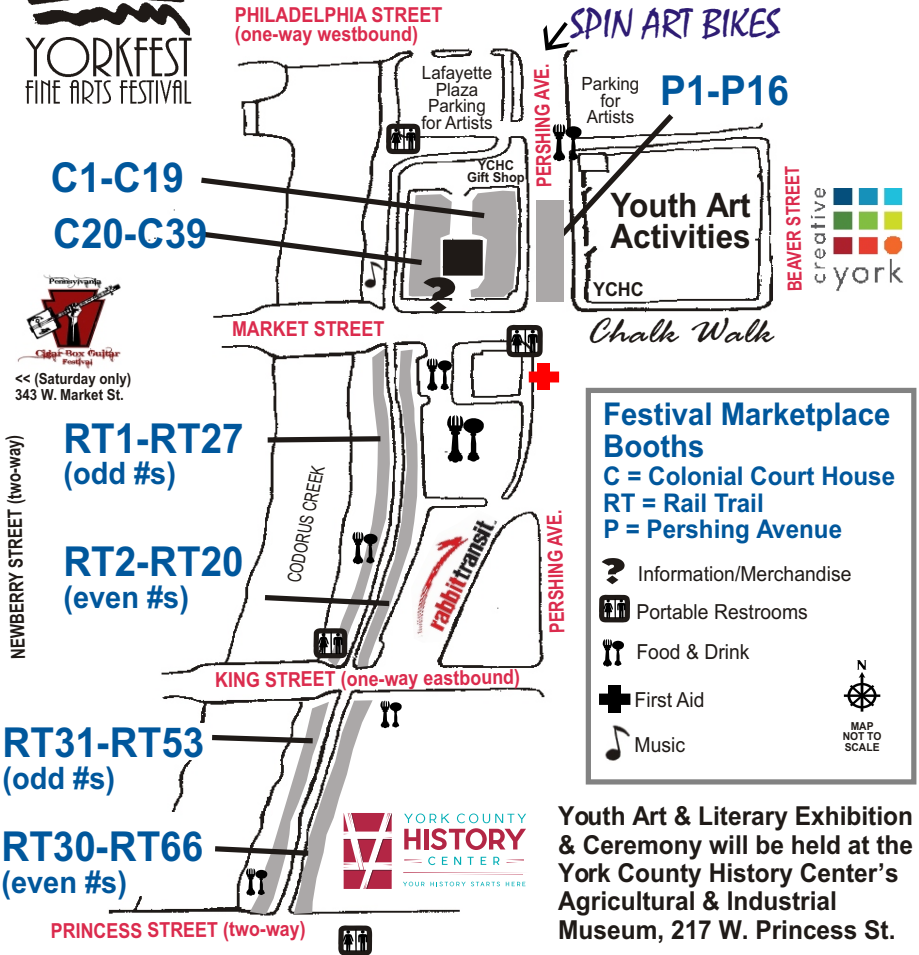

The City of York is proud to partner with Fiel Patricio as the 2019 Yorkfest Featured Artist.

Fiel Patricio is an artist based in York, Pennsylvania. She creates abstract and experimental mixed media works using water-based mediums. She also integrates collage, linocuts, woodcuts, and printmaking into her art.

For the past twelve years, she has participated in and been juried to several group and solo shows and exhibitions, including the upcoming 2019 Pennsylvania Water Color Society's (PWS) 40th Juried Exhibition at the Lancaster Museum of Art this August. She has also received several art awards, including the Rottler Award for Excellence in the Visual Arts given by the York Art Association.

She attained her signature status into the Baltimore Watercolor Society in 2010 and Philadelphia Water Color Society in 2011. She is also a member of the Pennsylvania Watercolor Society.

She served on the Executive Board at the York Art Association between 2008-2010 and Pennsylvania Water Color Society between 2013-2014.

Fiel is also a published photographer whose works have been included in the 4th Edition of Schmap New York Guide and were also released for the iPhone® and iPod Touch® in 2008.

Her gallery/art studio is located at Hive Artspace in York, Pennsylvania.

The Yorkfest Fine Arts Festival is York's premier summer fine arts festival along the Heritage Rail Trail and in the Colonial Complex. This event reflects the partnership between the City of York's former Riverwalk Arts Festival and Exhibition and the Yorkfest Music Festival, which began as part of York County's 250th anniversary celebration in August 1999, and is now an event run by York City Recreation and Parks.

The Yorkfest Fine Arts Festival celebrates the arts with an annual presentation of diverse, high-quality visual and literary arts for the enrichment, education, and enjoyment of Central Pennsylvania and beyond.

First Aid services are located on Pershing Avenue near Market Street.

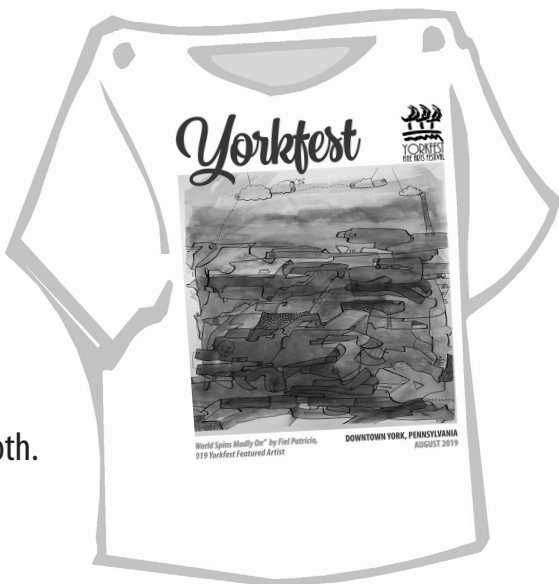

Yorkfest Artist Awards

Prizes totaling \$1,500 will be awarded to Yorkfest Festival Marketplace artists based on the overall works of their booth and presentation:

- Best in Show
- Award of Excellence
- Best New to Show
- Award of Distinction (six winners)

This year's jurors are Judeth Pekala Hawkins, Marion Stephenson, and Patricia Wertz

A graduate of the University of Michigan, Judeth's intensely personal work and unmistakable style has been recognized and awarded throughout the Mid Atlantic United States. Her work is in many private collections and is represented by several local galleries.

Marion Stephenson's professional education began at Kendall School of Design in Grand Rapids, Michigan. After graduating, she went to New York City to work as a graphic designer. Marion began attending classes at the Art Students League and soon became a full-time student immersed in the study of classical painting with Frank Mason and Robert Hale. Throughout the years she also has taken workshops with Albert Handell, Burt Silverman, Max Ginsburg, and John Howard Sanden, to name a few. Marion's work has been shown in numerous galleries, solo and group shows, and juried exhibitions; the last one is the Art of the State Juried Exhibition that is at the State Museum in Harrisburg. She has received awards for her paintings, the latest was Best of Show at York Art Association Juried Exhibit 2015. In her portfolio there are many public and private commissions ranging from landscape paintings, portraits, to murals. Included in her body of work are two large, outdoor murals: one for the city of York, PA ("From Farm to Market"); the other for the National Watch and Clock Museum in Columbia, PA. Memberships include the National Pastel Society, Oil Painters of America, American Women Artists, Art Student League (Life Member), and York Art Association. Also, Marion received a scholarship membership to the Salmagundi Club while a student at the Art Students League in New York.

Born in York, PA, Patricia Wertz graduated with a BFA from Moore College of Art, Philadelphia, PA. She has worked as a graphic designer in advertising and magazine publication in Boston, Philadelphia and Southern California in addition to exhibiting in numerous juried and group shows over the years. In 1979 she moved to Lancaster, PA, designing for Armstrong World Industries. Retiring in 2004 as a principal designer, she has pursued her dream of painting full time. Her works in oil range from landscape, floral, figurative and the narrative.

Community Mural Project

Our goal is to create a public piece of art that has an impact on the diverse community of York City that helps to create it. People of all ages will be encouraged to participate and to learn about art and the mural process. They will leave with a sense of pride and belonging; a part of the greater whole that is York. York City is full of history, and its murals reflect that. While beautiful and important to our history, many of the current murals are not relatable to our citizens. As we are seeing an arts revolution in the City of York, it seems only right that we continue to beautify our surroundings with art that is modern and community oriented, not simply one artist's view of what is beautiful, but a community coming together to create something lasting.

Led by local artist Rita Whitney, participants will have the opportunity to learn painting techniques, and the process of creating a mural, as well as a sense of self-expression and access to local artists to share in the joy of art making and develop a sense of community.

This year's juror is Lauren Nye, Director of Exhibitions at the Susquehanna Art Museum (SAM) in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Prior, she served as Art Program Director at Gallery360 and as Gallery Manager at Isadore Gallery, both in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Nye graduated from Millersville University with concentrations in art history and sculpture, with experience in bronze foundry metalworking. She was selected as artist-in-residence for the Millersville sculpture studio and the Nyholm Foundation in Denmark. She has curated exhibitions at a variety of venues for nine years and assisted in sculpture installations both nationally and internationally. Additionally, she served as a juror and/or judge for exhibitions at regional arts organizations such as the York Art Association, Berks Art Council, Whitaker Center, and Millersville University where she was honored to be the first alumni juror in exhibition history.

Her interest in public art sparked the beginning of the SAM mural project, and she successfully coordinated the installation of an ambitious 1,400 sq. ft. outdoor mural in the Midtown district of Harrisburg. Nye's speaking engagements include the PA Museums Conference at the State Museum of Pennsylvania, the Impact Arts Conference panel on the challenges of opening a successful art space, and PechaKucha Harrisburg on the role of arts in urban beautification.

She has been working at Creative York for ten years now and loves seeing children's excitement as they create and discover new things.

Carol Clark Williams is the youth literary juror. Carol Clark Williams is poet laureate emeritus of York, Pennsylvania and a rostered artist for the Arts in Education StART Something. She teaches poetry workshops in high schools, libraries, prisons, support groups, and halfway houses. She has recently received the Above and Beyond award from the National Federation of State Poetry Societies for her work with young people. Carol's poems have been published in print and online journals including Mad Poets Review, Margie, Byline, Passager, The Pedestal, and Bent Pin Quarterly. She has authored two poetry books: Escaped Without Injury and Stories of the Tribe.

The sidewalks of downtown York become an artist's canvas and a place for audiences to watch works of art being created right before their eyes. 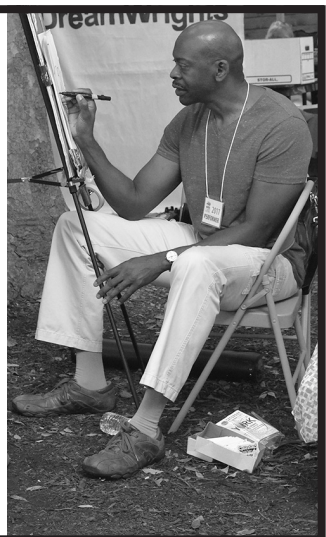
