WHEREAS, Section 461 of the PA Liquor Code (47 P.S. §4-461, et., seq., hereinafter the “Code”) requires that the issuance of a liquor license for economic development must, under certain conditions, first be approved by the governing body of the receiving municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Code mandates that at least one public hearing be held for the purpose of receiving public testimony from individuals residing within the municipality concerning the applicant’s intent to acquire an economic development liquor license with the PA Liquor Control Board; and

WHEREAS, Hamir’s Indian Fusion Restaurant (hereinafter “Applicant”) intends to establish a place of business at 24 S. George St., York, PA (hereinafter “Premises”) for the purpose of operating a restaurant serving Indian cuisine and alcoholic beverages on said premises; and

WHEREAS, on February 20, 2020, the applicant filed a written request for a hearing in front of York City Council regarding acquisition of an economic development liquor license from the PA Liquor Control Board for service of alcoholic beverages on said premises; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 at 6:00 p.m., York City Council held a public hearing on the economic development liquor license request from the applicant; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to comply with the PA Liquor Code, §4-461, et., seq.;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of York, Pennsylvania as follows:

1. The applicant qualifies and seeks approval of an economic development liquor license for the property located at 24 S. George St., York, PA, pursuant to the PA Liquor Code, §4-461, et., seq.
2. The applicant proposes to, and will, operate a restaurant and serve alcoholic beverages on said premises.
3. York City Council finds the issuance of an economic development liquor license to the applicant for said premises will promote economic development in the City of York.
4. York City Council finds that there is no evidence that the proposed economic development liquor license will adversely affect the welfare, health, peace and morals of the City of York and its residents.
5. York City Council hereby approves the applicant’s request for an economic development liquor license for service of alcoholic beverages at 24 S. George St., York, PA.
6. The issuance of said liquor license is hereby subject to final approval by the PA Liquor Control Board.
