Lettice Brown, resident, spoke about a rumor regarding a warehouse being proposed to be built at 1201 Pennsylvania Ave./180 Willis Rd. She said she and residents went to a West Manchester Township meeting and expressed their concerns. She said West Manchester Twp has changed the zoning from commercial to industrial in preparation for this project. It's supposed to be a 422,000 square foot facility with 200 parking spaces, and 70+ truck bays (Click here to view brochure) (Click here to view broker page). She said there are pictures of the proposed warehouse online. This strip of land use to be farmed and there are deer, fox, and fowl that call this place their home. Wildlife has been killed in mass numbers possibly to get ready for development. This is producing a tremendous amount of stormwater issues that will flood back into the City of York. The tributary that runs along Met-Ed will create flooding problems. There will be noise pollution, air pollution, and a decrease in property values if this warehouse is built. It will create a danger to those who visit the cemetery. The tax revenue will go to West Manchester Twp, but the problems will become ours. She said she and a group of about 20 concerned citizens met last week on who to contact to bring attention to this development. She said she contacted her environmental friends to get involved and now she's asking City Council and the Mayor to offer expertise or advice. She said we need the community's support and to reach out to the powers that be to bring attention to this proposed development. She said she is willing to meet with Council and the Administration if they would like to talk about it.
