**CALL TO ORDER:** President Walker called the January 17, 2023, meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in Council Chambers, 101 S. George St., York, PA, with the following members present: Felicia Dennis, Betsy Buckingham, Lou Rivera, Edquina Washington, Vice President, and Sandie Walker, President, with President Walker presiding.

I. Public Comment:

Ryan Brinkerhoff discussed parking issues during construction in his neighborhood. He said the neighbors are on edge with their parking because they never know when the construction is going on and they are afraid of getting parking violations. He asked that the construction contractor provide better signage as to when they'll be working because to shut down parking for weeks at a time is creating a problem for the neighborhood.

Franklin Williams stated that he reached out to Lettice Brown who spoke at Council's <u>1/3/23</u> meeting about the proposed warehouse to be built on Pennsylvania Ave. He said a Facebook page has since been created to inform residents about the project. He then discussed the proposed 2023 budget process and areas that he felt were not handled appropriately.

Marie Rohleder said many residents attended several meetings for the Strategic Comprehensive Plan and the College Ave gym and said she feels her time was wasted and that Council and the Administration did not do an adequate job of coordinating what was going on.

### XI. Council Comment:

President Walker said there was a resident that reached out to her and asked about the paving on George St. She said there are concerns about manholes and why the manholes weren't done prior to paving and why the manholes were not leveled. She said she would send this concern to the administration and will also ask the administration about the parking concerns brought up during public comment.

President Walker then responded to comments made by Mr. Williams during public comment about the budget process. She said if we are spending ARPA funds, we have to do our due diligence.

President Walker also responded to the comment made by Ms. Rohleder during the public comment. She said your concerns about the Comp Plan should be directed to the administration. She said staff turnover and vacancies have been creating delays in some city processes and she thought that when Council repealed the residency, it would help solve the hiring problems, but it has not.

Lastly, President Walker applauded all organizations who held Dr. Martin Luther King ceremonies and said it was good to see people in person again.

Councilman Rivera asked Acting Business Administrator Kim Robertson if she has seen more people applying for positions since the residency has been repealed.

Acting BA Robertson responded that she would have to consult with Human Resources but in general they have been able to fill some positions that have been lingering on for a while. But of the applications they are reviewing now, she said they are all city residents. She said she thinks we are successful in getting applications; however, skills set is another issue.

Acting BA Robertson then responded to President Walker's comment about manholes. She said the utility that is doing the construction is who is responsible for getting the manholes back into correct position.
