- 2. CLICK AT THE TOP RESIDENT.
- 3. DROP DOWN TO PERMITS & ZONING APPLICATION.
- 4. CLICK ON THE RED BOX VISIT OPEN GOV.
- 5. DROP DOWN TO TEMPORARY FOOD SERVICE PERMIT.
- 6. APPLY.

Once the application is filled out, wait for the approval of the health inspector. After the health inspector approves the application, you will then make your payment. The fee is \$35.00 for 1-3 consecutive days. You must apply for a temporary permit each time you have an event. Applicants may not exceed 14 temporary permits per calendar year. To qualify for a temporary food service permit, a SERVSAFE CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED. The certificate holder must be present at the event. The ServSafe certificate holder is the responsible person in charge. You must have a ServSafe certificate to sale or give away food to the public. You must apply for and pay for a temporary food service permit a week prior to the event or your permit may be denied. Failure to apply for a temporary food service permit and a vendor is operating at an event, the vendor will be asked to leave the event escorted by York city police and it could result in a citation from the city of York.

All food must be prepared in a licensed kitchen or on site.

1105.08 FOOD PREPARATION AND SALES ON PUBLIC STREETS, RIGHT- OF-WAYS AND SIDEWALKS. No person shall sell, process, prepare, cook, or offer for public consumption any food products on the public streets, right-of-ways and sidewalks within the City of York without first obtaining the proper permits and licensing and undergoing an inspection.
