CURBS & SIDEWALKS, REPAIRS & REPLACEMENTS (Codified Ordinance 909.19)
Owners of property abutting on any public street or highway within the City, shall at their expense, construct, pave, curb, repave and re-curb the sidewalks and keep them in good repair along such property, in conformity with existing City ordinances. (Ord. 9-1945 §1.)

STORMWATER UPDATE

It will be soon time to break out the lawn mowers and start cleaning up our outdoor spaces. Here

and start cleaning up our outdoor spaces. Here are a few reminders:

Remember to keep grass clippings out of the street, sidewalk, and gutters. Grass clippings in the street and other areas can be dangerous (especially if raining) to motorcyclists, bicyclists, and pedestrians. Did you know that grass clippings become almost as slippery as ice when wet? We want to ensure the safety of all our residents. Please sweep or blow the clippings back onto the grass and out of the street; or bag them and throw out with your regular trash. them and throw out with your regular trash. **Refrain** from using an excessive amount of fertilizers or weed controllers to ensure the

fertilizers or weed controllers to ensure the excess does not run off with the next rain storm, The chemicals will eventually reach our creeks and streams without any filtration, and can harm a wide variety of aquatic life.

Washing Vehicles on the street or driveway is illegal if you are using ANY type of soap or cleaning agents. Use just water, but no soaps. Pull vehicles up onto the grass to wash with soan but the soan must not leave your property. soap, but the soap must not leave your property. If it does, a citation may be issued. If you have any questions, or would like to report an illicit discharge, please call 717-324-6532.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS
POTHOLES - How do I report?
Call the 24-hour hotline service, 717-849-2228, give an exact location (street name, block), and leave a message.
STRETLIGHTS OUT - How do I report a problem? Identify the exact location (street name, closest address of a building), include the pole number (ten-digit number located on a yellow metal tag on the pole, example 22550-28665). If the number is missing from the pole, please report. Identify the problem (light out, goes on and off). Call the Electrical Bureau at 717-845-9351 or email cgodfrey@yorkcity.org.
TREE TRIMMING (Codified Ordinance Article 913.03)
(a) Any tree or shrub which overhangs any sidewalk, street or public

(a) Any tree or shrub which overhangs any sidewalk, street or public place in such a way as to impeded or interfere with traffic or travel on such public place including City street sweepers and other vehicles requiring a high clearance on roadways, shall be trimmed by the owner of the abutting premises on which such trees or shrub grows, to a height of a minimum of fourteen feet above the roadway and eight feet above the sidewalk so that the obstruction shall cease (Ord. 5-1995. Passed 4-18-95) (b) Any tree or limb of a tree which has become likely to fall on or across any public way or place, shall be removed by the owner of the premises on which such tree grows or stands.



ENVIRONMENTAL BUREAU / refuserecycling@yorkcity.org

The Environmental Bureau works to provide a clean, healthy and beautiful City by managing refuse, recycling, large item and yard waste collections. All York City residents and commercial, municipal and institutional establishments are mandated to recycle designated material according to the State's Act 101 and York City's Ordinance, Article 952.

RECYCLING was mandated in 1989 by local and state laws for all residential, commercial, and industrial properties within the City of York. Since 2018, some items that were being marketed to China are no longer accepted. Those materials were removed from our curbside recyclable program.

Do not line recycling containers with bags.

Knowing what to put in your recycling bin is very important. If you put items into your recycling bin that do not belong there, the entire bin might be considered "contaminated."

NOT every metal, glass, plastic, or paper item is recyclable. Only these (metal, glass, and plastic) containers below, along with clean corrugated cardboard and newspaper should be placed for recycling in York City.



Metal Cans Glass Bottles/Jars

(RINSED cans, bottles and jars that had food or drink in them direct from the grocery store; No lids; NO household dishes, glasses, mugs, mirrors, window glass



Plastic Bottles/Jars

(RINSED drink, food, laundry, bath bottles, and jars that have #1 or #2 in a triangle on the bottom of the container; No bags/deli, yogurt, or butter, bowls, cups, trays, film, toys, etc.



Newspaper must be clean and dry; not glossy or contaminated newspaper.



Corrugated Cardboard Boxes must be clean, dry, flattened and contaminated newspaper bundled; No paperboard/chipboard)

LARGE-ITEM COLLECTION

Hours: Monday through Thursday, 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM York City Curbside Customers may schedule up to 5 normal household furniture/appliance items. Some excluded items must be handled privately. ANY ITEMS WITH BEDBUGS (dead or alive) MUST BE BAGGED (in large mattress bags) AND SEALED WITH DUCT TAPE prior to scheduling. Bags are available at stores such as Walmart, Lowes, Home Depot and at U-Haul.

REFUSE COLLECTIONS Republic Services is the current curbside collections hauler through 4/30/2025. NOTE: City Ordinance, Art 951 - ALL TRASH MUST BE IN SECURELY TIED TRASH BAGS EVEN WHEN USING A TRASH CAN. Tied bags to a place alone or like the control of the c inside a plastic or metal trash can with a detached lid and handles Max: 32 gallons (contents should never extend above the top edge of any container); Max: 40 pounds; Tied bundles of building wood not to exceed 3' x 1' x 1'. Do NOT use for trash: contractor/leaf/grocery bags, large "tote" carts or any can over 32-gals, cans with attached lids, plastic or metal drums, cardboard boxes, milk crates, and baskets. Illegal containers may be discarded and NO Refund/Replacement will be given. Use sturdy bags sold specifically for trash disposal; max 32-gals.

Trash Collection Tips:

Cooking Oil Pour cooled cooking oil, in a thick plastic detergent bottle with a tight-fitting lid. Discard in a securely tied (double-bagged) trash bag. (This bottle should NOT be recycled).

Lumber Small quantities of building lumber may be placed for regular trash collection. Wood must be cut down and securely bundled. (Maximum bundle size: 3' long x 1' x 1' and 40 pounds) Each bundle of building lumber (not broken furniture wood) replaces a bag of trash.

Medication Do NOT flush any medication. Instead, mix unused medication with undesirables (i.e., coffee grounds or used cat litter) and place in regular trash for incineration. Occasionally, there are medication drop-off programs held at local Police

Needles/Sharps Discard needles, scalpel blades, broken ampoules, or anything used by patients that may be considered contaminated, by placing them in a heavy plastic detergent bottle with a tight-fitting lid. Discard in a securely tied trash bag (This bottle should NOT be

Paint and Paint Products Add cat litter to liquid paint/product to absorb most of the moisture. Then, securely seal all containers before placing them, in small quantities, in securely tied (doubled) trash bags with normal trash. Bags should not exceed 40 pounds.

Tires ONLY Residential customers may place up to 2 passenger tires, off the rim, for regular trash collection. Each tire replaces a bag of trash and counts toward the overall bag limit. However, tires on the rim must be scheduled (7-10 days in advance) for large-item

Commercial Units/Customers may NOT place any tires for curbside collection. This is considered ILLEGAL DUMPING and fines may be imposed up to \$600 per occurrence. The public is encouraged to report any person dumping tires to Public Works at 717-849-2245. Include a description of the person(s) and a license of their vehicle. Security video and photos are welcomed and can be extremely helpful.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTIONS occur on your first trash day each week, this year from Mar 4th - Dec 10th, weather permitting. Yard waste must kept separate from the normal trash and must be prepared for collection according to these specifications:

BRUSH Bundled branches, each branch must be less than 4" in diameter (maximum bundle size: 3' x 1' and 40 pounds); or use authorized yellow yard waste cans (maximum: 40 pounds). Branches should NOT extend above rim of cans or bags.

LEAVES/PRUNINGS/GARDEN RESIDUE(NO GRASS CLIPPINGS):

Use biodegradable kraft paper bags (maximum: 32 gallons; 40 pounds); or use authorized yellow yard waste cans (maximum: 40 pounds). Yard waste should NOT extend above rim of cans or bags.

Customers are reminded that plastic bags are NOT accepted for yard waste and will result in no collection. Do NOT line yard waste cans with bags. Grass clippings should be placed in trash bags with regular trash and do count in the normal bag limit.
